READ & REFLECT:

Read Psalm 149

What word, image, or phrase sticks out to you from this passage?

Eugene Peterson once wrote, "The hallelujah and the amen are combined in a celebration meal. Our deepest capacity for praise and our deepest impulse for affirmation are focused at this table, where God's goodness and God's yes are expressed in sacrament. Two words and a blessing. An invitation to eat at God's table. Polish up your hallelujah."

What is one practice in your daily or weekly routine that "polishes up" your hallelujah?

What are some things that dull or dim your hallelujah?

Spend some time reflecting on the above quote, what is one practice that you could add to your daily or weekly routine that would add more clarity and depth to your hallelujahs?

PRACTICE: Celebration
