READ: JOSHUA 24:1-8, 13-15

QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION:

It is easy to fall into the trap of believing that the fruit we hold is the produce of our own hands, and the byproduct our intellect or actions. But God gives Israel, and us, clarity that God alone is the source of any freedom or fortune we may receive, reminding us that strength for those who follow Him is in remembrance.

How is this difficult for you to believe, both in your life, and in the life of the church?

How might this be an invitation?

In Joshua 24:12, God says through Joshua, "not by your sword or by your bow." Sit with this verse for a bit, using it as a breath prayer. Begin with your life, family, home in mind - Breath in, "not by my sword" breath out "or by my bow."Then transition to praying this prayer over the church. Breath in "not by my sword" breath out "or by my bow." Write anything you notice from this prayer below.

PRACTICE OF THE WEEK:

Gratitude

As the Israelites gather to renew their covenant with God in Chapter 24, Joshua begins his address by reminding them of the redemptive story that has led them to this place of abundance.

How would you write your own additions to this story? Begin by including what is mentioned here, or by reflecting on Stephen's recollection of God's faithfulness in the 7th Chapter of Acts. Then add a timeline, story, or list highlighting some of the places where you find evidence of God's deliverance and provision.
